





HOPE was formed in 1994 by Harbor Regional Center and concerned parents who were worried about their children's future housing stability.

Create stable, affordable housing for people with developmental disabilities.

HOPE envisions a world in which all people with disabilities can live where and with whom they choose in safe neighborhoods at affordable rents.

social IMPACT

The value of empowering individuals to live as active and contributing members of their communities is at the very heart of HOPE. And there is no doubt—living a life as independently as possible, and having a place to call home, changes people's lives.

HOPE partners with Regional Centers to offer a variety of housing models. Regional Centers are private, nonprofit corporations that contract with the State Department of Developmental Services to provide or coordinate services and supports for individuals with developmental disabilities that include autism, cerebral palsy, intellectual disability, and epilepsy.

Since 1995 HOPE homes have allowed people with developmental disabilities to live a life they may have only dreamed about. Whether residing in a HOPE Independent Living, 24-hour Residential Care, Supportive or College to Career housing, HOPE tenants are making their dreams come true.

our PROGRAMS

HOPE Independent Living homes empower adults with developmental disabilities to live with increased self-reliance without the threat of social isolation. Our residents pay 30% of their income toward rent and receive varying levels of in-house supported services.

HOPE 24-Hour Residential Care homes serve people with increased medical and behavioral needs. Our residents receive around the clock support from state licensed service providers in safe, comfortable home environments that are certified through the California Department of Social Services and California Department of Public Health.

HOPE College to Career housing provides a dorm-like setting for students with developmental disabilities attending community college. These residents are in pursuit of a certificate or degree and may require additional on campus and residential supports.

HOPE Supportive Housing provides residents with individual units and access to broader supported living services from staff working out of dedicated, on-site offices. This model is designed for people who are interested in moving from more restrictive housing models, such as 24-hour residential care homes, institutions, or hospitalized settings, or who are transitioning out of living in a parent's home.

Community Celebrates

Grand Opening of HOPE on Redondo!

Long Beach: We were deeply moved on June 26th by the outpouring of support that HOPE received at the grand opening of our newest homes on the 100 block of Redondo Avenue. Thank you to those in attendance, volunteers, and, of course, our many project partners. This day would not have been possible without you. Our guests heard from Mayor Robert Garcia, Councilwoman Suzie Price, HRC Executive Director Pat Del Monico, and many others about how important housing like this is for the community and specifically for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

This rehabilitated, six-units of housing is now home to seven low-income adults with I/DD, while one onsite unit is reserved for supportive living service staff. The project was funded with







support from the City of Long Beach and the Long Beach Community Investment Company, as well as foundation grants from Bank of the West, Wells Fargo, Bess J. Hodges Foundation, Union Bank, The Ahmanson Foundation, Del Harbor Foundation, and Opus Bank. On-site services will be made available to residents through Harbor Regional Center and Ambitions CA.

OPE knows that living an ordinary, independent life is a primary goal for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). Housing plays an enormous role in achieving that objective, but how can someone afford a home in this challenging real estate market without a job? If HOPE truly wants to be a part of the solution, then we also must prioritize creating employment opportunities for this population. That is why, in 2016, we started a contract with the landscaping arm of Social Vocation Services (SVS), a statewide service provider for people with I/DD.

SVS was founded in 1977 as a small after-school program for teenagers with autism. Since its establishment, SVS has grown to serve over 4,000 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities throughout California. They offer a wide variety of services to meet the needs and interests of a diverse population, from day programs, work programs, and licensed group homes. Their landscaping business has been operating for nearly 20 years while providing jobs and personal growth

opportunities for people with I/DD. The current employment rate for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in California lags far behind the rate for those without disabilities, as well as the rate for people with all other types of disabilities. While a majority of people with I/DD desire to work, the State Council on Developmental Disabilities (SCDD) reports that during the past decade, little more than 13% of this population has been employed. Despite efforts to enhance employment opportunities, substantial barriers to accessing gainful employment still persist for a majority of these individuals.

This reality has a significant impact on the ability of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities to afford rents. Currently, 8 out of 10 people with I/DD must rely on Supplemental Security Income (SSI) to support themselves. A typical SSI payment is around \$900 a month or \$10,800 a year. SSI-level income is less than 20% of the area

median income for Los Angeles County and below the 2019 federal poverty line of \$12,490. According to the 2014 Half in Ten Report from the Center for American Progress, 28.4% of adults with disabilities live in poverty, and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities represent 16% of all adults living in poverty.

Housing is generally considered affordable when the rent or mortgage is no more than thirty percent of a person's income. For a person living on a \$900 a month SSI payment, affordability would translate to no more than \$270 a month. Rents at this level are nonexistent in Los Angeles County. In fact, in Los Angeles, an average one-bedroom apartment rents for \$1,360 and is five times more than what a person living on SSI can afford.

Jobs are vital to addressing this issue for people with I/DD. The SVS Downey Community Inclusion Services gardening group is just one example of the wide variety of work opportunities SVS offers their clients statewide. In order to be employed by SVS as a landscaper, candidates must demonstrate safety awareness skills and the ability to operate gardening equipment such as lawnmowers, edgers, or weed and hedge trimmers.

HOPE will be looking for ways to further expand our use of their excellent services.





Employees of this service take pride in their work. They are very detail oriented and guarantee a beautifully landscaped yard every time. HOPE can attest that they genuinely care about us as customers and the lawns and gardens they service.

When a person with an intellectual or developmental disability is given the opportunity to work, they benefit in more ways than just receiving a paycheck.

There is pride in being able to contribute financially to their independence, a chance to make friends, and an overall ability to stay active and feel useful. "There's a lot to do," employee Ignacio M. says, "It keeps me busy. I like to use the lawnmower!"

Because of our donors, volunteers, and advocates, HOPE can pursue our mission of creating stable, affordable homes for people with developmental disabilities, while never losing track of why we do what we do. 





HOPE is once again delighted to welcome Rob Fukuzaki as our emcee for this year's event.

Rob Fukuzaki is the weekday sports anchor for ABC7 Eyewitness News, as well as host of special sports programming like Slam Dunk, and Chargers pre- and post-game shows. When Rob joined ABC7 in 1994, he became the first male Japanese-American TV anchor in Los Angeles local TV News.

Rob was born on July 4 in Torrance, California, but was raised in Honolulu, Hawaii, where his family relocated when he was 3 years old.

Rob attended Mid-Pacific Institute, a private high school in Honolulu, and graduated in 1984. He attended the University of La Verne in Southern California and earned a B.A. in Broadcast Journalism with an emphasis in radio and television in 1988. While at La Verne, Rob was chosen the university's Broadcaster of the Year in 1986, 1987 and 1988. He also won several awards from the Southern California Broadcast Journalism Society.

Rob worked for the Top 40 radio station KXPW in Hawaii. In 1989, Rob began working part-time for KITV in Honolulu doing sports reporting. He eventually got a full-time slot in late 1989, working as the station's weekday sports reporter and weekend anchor. One of his more memorable assignments at KITV was an award-winning hour-long special on Sumo in Japan. The broadcast featured the three top-ranked wrestlers from Hawaii, including Grand Champion Akebono and Grand Champion Musashimaru.

Since joining ABC7, Rob has done a great deal of work for the community, hosting charity events and emceeing benefit dinners. In 1997, Rob - along with his friends and family - founded the Heads Up Youth Foundation, of which Rob is the chairman. 

hank you to you – our partners – for another stellar year at HOPE. It continues to be my great pleasure to lead this organization alongside an outstanding team of board members, staff, funders, business partners, donors, and volunteers. Because of your support, HOPE has continued to grow and expand its mission of offering safe and stable affordable homes to those in our communities who are the most vulnerable. As housing costs and rents continue to skyrocket, and demand for affordable housing climbs for people with intellectual or developmental disabilities (I/DD), your support is more critical than ever. So thank you for being there along-side us, for generously supporting our growth, and for continuing to make housing for those we serve a priority with your time and your giving.

We are so pleased to be able to, year after year, create additional affordable housing for new residents. With the grand openings of our multi-family properties on Daisy and Redondo in Long Beach, we were able to offer homes to 14 additional people, with Harbor Regional Center and their partners supporting these individuals with on-site services. We already have an additional seven units of specialized housing in the works for this coming year. During this past fiscal year alone, HOPE grew our total housing assets across all programs by over seven million dollars. Our banking, foundation, CDFI, and city partners helped provide us the capital to be able to make and finance these important purchases.

Of course, there will always be a need at HOPE to develop more affordable housing, but it is equally important to us that our existing homes are in the best condition possible, and that our clients are living in the safest and healthiest environments. To that end, the foundation community supported us with over \$350,000 in grants; most of these funds went to upgrading and renovating the oldest homes in our portfolio, providing

accessible features where needed. This "Aging in Place" initiative will continue over the next several years, and we invite you to be a part of it as a donor.

Speaking of donors, this year we also welcomed new Mission Makers and Ambassador 5 Circle Members to our team. These are our recurring-gift and major-gift givers. Those of you who generously support these programs are genuinely making a sustaining impact and empowering us to do the work we do. Thank you.

We are so proud of the accomplishments we have achieved this year in collaboration with our donors, colleagues, volunteers, and corporate partners. Thank you for enabling our mission!

- ♦ HOPE once again has dedicated more than 85% of our budget to directly support programming.
- ♦ HOPE has increased fixed assets during the 18-19 fiscal year by 15% or \$7.3 million.
- ♦ HOPE completed aging in place renovations on our first two acquired properties from 25 years ago. These property renovations enable our residents to have greater accessibility to their home and remain in the neighborhood of their choice.
- ♦ HOPE purchased four new properties in Long Beach and three in Torrance consisting of 13 units that will serve 31 clients with developmental disabilities. HOPE renovated six properties in Long Beach and Carson, supporting 26 clients with developmental disabilities.
- HOPE opened its newly renovated supportive housing located on Daisy Avenue in the historic Wilmore neighborhood of Long Beach. The property consists of five units and will serve seven residents with developmental disabilities, while one unit is reserved as an office for supported living services staff.
- ♦ HOPE hosted a grand opening to celebrate the completion of our newest Supportive Housing homes on the 100 block of Redondo Avenue. This rehabilitated, six-units of housing is now home to seven low-income adults with developmental disabilities.
- This year, 51 volunteers completed 529 hours of service in support of our •••• cause. These contributions are valued at more than \$15,844.
- ♦ HOPE's 11th Annual Charity Golf Classic raised more than \$200K to provide additional affordable, stable homes for people with developmental disabilities.
- ♦ HOPE was awarded more than \$351,000 in grants to support our mission. Among others, foundations included the Ahmanson Foundation (\$100,000) and Wells Fargo Foundation (\$50,000).
- ♦ HOPE hired the new Communications and Fundraising Coordinator Lauren Quijano.
- ♦ HOPE continues to be active participants in the coordination of the Lanterman Housing Alliance and the Long Beach Affordable Housing Developers Roundtable.





PROPERTY LOAN TO MARKET VALUE





HOMES ON DAISY AVENUE IN LONG BEACH

OPEN FOR HOPE RESIDENTS WHO DESIRE GREATER INDEPENDENCE





eople with developmental disabilities live everywhere," says Kristin Martin, Executive Director of HOPE, Inc. "That's why we are intentional in our strategy to create affordable housing options where they live, in as many unique communities as possible. So we are thrilled to be opening up our first homes in the historic Wilmore neighborhood of Long Beach."

This new housing opened in summer 2019 and is located on Daisy Avenue less than one mile from downtown. The location, with convenient access to transportation and services, is ideal for HOPE residents. The property will be home to seven individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities (I/DD), and was completed

in partnership with Harbor Regional Center, Long Beach Development Services, Long Beach Community Investment Corporation, and California MENTOR. The site consists of five units that will serve seven residents, while one unit is reserved as an office for supported living services staff.

These homes are being made available for individuals who desire to live more independently than their current housing arrangement. This will mean that adults who are currently living with their aging parents, in 24-hour residential care group homes, or in other types of staterun institutions, will have the opportunity to live with greater self-reliance.



There is an urgency to build more of this type of housing. A recent survey of 102 people with I/DD, conducted by the State Council on Developmental Disabilities and the Lanterman Housing Alliance, found that 85% of respondents living with their parents reported a desire to live independently alone or with roommates. These individuals reported limited finances, lack of affordable housing options, and lack of accessible housing as the barriers to their ability to achieve these housing goals. If that percentage is reflective of a larger desire in this population, the units needed to meet demand throughout the state could be in the tens of thousands.

As was mentioned, this new HOPE housing is located in the Willmore City historic district, which was first developed by early city pioneer William E. Willmore in the late 19th century from a subdivision of Rancho Los Cerritos. It is the site of the original township of Willmore City and contains Drake Park named for Colonel Charles Rivers Drake, developer of the Pike amusement complex and the Knoll Park housing development. Part of this area became a historic district—Long Beach's first—in 1978; since then the residents have been preserving and protecting it. The entire neighborhood now enjoys the protection of the historic designation.

As a now proud member of this community, HOPE made certain that the entirety of our renovation plan conformed to the neighborhood's historic preservation guidelines. Here is a link to the districts website (willmorecity.org). During the renovation process, HOPE preserved the porches on all units, the columns on the front of the main house, the wood siding on all three units, the stairways, wooden windows, wooden fencing, concrete pathways and the exterior tri-color scheme.

With renovations completed in mid-April, resident interviews were coordinated immediately by California MENTOR. California MENTOR is a nonprofit organization with the mission to offer adults innovative, quality services and supports that lead to growth and independence, regardless of the physical, intellectual or behavioral challenges they face. Moving forward, they will be onsite during work days to provide the needed supported living services for HOPE's newest residents on Daisy Ave.

This type of housing is so important for the security and quality of life of people with I/DD. Like current HOPE resident, Jody, who in the past bounced around between different expensive housing options and feared that she would never find a safe, stable, long-term home that was affordable. Her parents confessed that they were concerned for their daughter and not certain what Jody would do once they were no longer able to take care of her. Luckily she found HOPE and has been a tenant with our organization for more than 20 years. "I never thought I would live in such nice housing," says Jody, "and it's actually affordable."

Additional collaborators on this project include, First Republic Bank, Dilworth Construction, real estate agent Todd McIntosh, Appleby Property Management, Gonzalez Construction, and architects Brad Fowers and Brian Noteware. Finally, the Long Beach Water department in February completed an installation of a new drought-tolerant landscape in the front yard. This garden was a generous donation through their DIG program. HOPE is always looking for ways to utilize sustainable housing practices and asset management in our portfolio.


